

## The Monongahela Incline

The Monongahela Incline was built in the 1870's and is still in use today as a means of public transportation. It is owned and operated by Pittsburgh Regional Transit Authority. It offers dynamic views of Pittsburgh's skyline and connects Station Square, the Smithfield Street Bridge and rail service with Shiloh Street, one of Mount Washington's business districts featuring shops and dining.



## Observation Platforms



The iconic observation platforms along Grandview Avenue were built in the 1970's but recently went through an extensive renovation by the City of Pittsburgh. There are 4 platforms that all offer slightly different vantage points revealing skyscrapers, bridges and river views not visible from the other platforms. Be sure to visit them all and have your cameras ready!



Emerald View Park, features the famous "Point of View" statue and hiking trails offering scenic vistas of Pittsburgh's skyline, three rivers and a number of bridges. There are over 19 miles of trails to experience nature and wildlife. Be sure to follow the hiker icon on the map inside to find the trail heads.
